TREE PLANTATION

07/07/2023

On the occasion of Van Mahostav, The Ecolution Club in collaboration with NSS unit of Chitkara Universty, Himachal Pradesh planned a Tree Plantation drive at two different locations i.e. Govt. Senior Secondary School, Sheran (An adopted village by Chitkara University, Solan, H.P.) and a village park in the presence of village panchayat officials on 7th July 2023. As the event was organized in collaboration with NSS, there were many NSS volunteers present on the ground, all prepared to guide the students.

The event was carried out for approximately 2 hours in which every student was given a plant. Each individual student planted at least one tree. Each plant was watered separately. To plant a single tree the distance between the plants was considered, so each tree must get sufficient nutrition. Even some teachers were helping the students in plowing the soil along with the gardeners (helpers). Around 35 trees were planted in the school ground with the combined efforts of student teachers and gardeners.




CONSTITUTION DAY

Conclusion:-





Introduction:

The Viksit Bharat Youth Parliament is a platform for young voices to engage in national discussions and shape the vision for Viksit Bharat@2047. It fosters leadership, civic participation, and policy discussions, enabling students to deliberate on key national issues. Inspired by Hon'ble PM Shri Narendra Modi Ji's vision, this edition is fully offline and implemented through MY Bharat to maximize youth participation.

The National Youth Parliament Festival (NYPF) has been organised annually since 2019 to provide a platform for young voices in India. The first edition in 2019 saw participation from 700 delegates representing each district, with 56 finalists at the national level. Each edition concluded with the top three winners sharing their thoughts at the Central Hall of Parliament, followed by an interactive session and address to the youth.

This year, the National Youth Parliament Festival has been reimagined as the **Viksit Bharat Youth Parliament**, aligning with the vision of **Viksit Bharat@2047**. As per vision of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi Ji was rooted in the belief that India's youth are not just the beneficiaries of development but also the architects of its future. Inspired by this clarion call, this year's Youth Parliament has been reimagined and expanded, aligning with the Viksit Bharat@2047 vision to prepare a new generation of dynamic, solution-oriented, and policy-aware youth leaders.

This transformation reflects a more structured approach to youth engagement in policymaking, governance, and national discourse. Unlike previous editions, all rounds will be conducted offline, ensuring a more immersive and impactful experience. With a multitiered structure spanning district, state, and national levels, the event aims to provide young voices with a formal platform to deliberate on pressing national issues, interact with policymakers, and contribute meaningfully to India's developmental journey.

Objectives of organising the Viksit Bharat Youth Parliament:

- To hear the voice of youth between 18-25 years of age, through deliberations at District, State and National levels.
- To encourage the youth to engage with public issues, understand the common man's point of view, form their opinions and express them in an articulate manner.
- To develop and enhance decision-making abilities.
- To develop in them respect and tolerance for the views of others.
- To develop in them an understanding that respect for rules is essential for conducting any discussion systematically and effectively.
- To obtain and document their opinions on the Vision of Viksit Bharat.
- To make available their views to policymakers and implemented to take it forward.





Criteria for Participation:

- Youth to participate in Youth Parliament must be between 18 to 25 years of age as of 24th February 2025. The onus will be on the participant to furnish correct information in this regard. Furnishing false information will lead to disqualification from participation in the Viksit Bharat Youth Parliament.
- The representation of women and others from marginalized sections should be encouraged.

Viksit Bharat Youth Parliament 2025 – District Solan at Chitkara University, Himachal Pradesh:

Registration will be done via MY Bharat portal. A maximum of 150 participants will be shortlisted for the district nodal round. The topic for the One-minute video to be uploaded for registration will be: 'What does Viksit Bharat mean to you?'

Chitkara University, Himachal Pradesh, had the honor of hosting the Viksit Bharat Youth Parliament 2025 for District Solan. This prestigious event was conducted with the support of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India, and aimed to provide a platform for young minds to express their views on key national topics.
